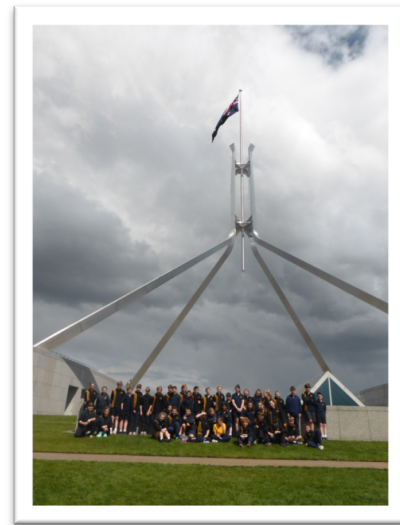
In week 10 of term three, most of the year 6/7s went to Canberra. We went there to learn about Australia's history and democracy.
