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How to make a pocket heart

- 1. Choose your two colours and use your template to cut a heart shape from wool felt.
- 2. Anchor your thread by sewing three stitches on top of each other, in the top centre of your heart.
- 3. Sew around your heart until you have just a small hole for stuffing; blanket or whip stitch work well.
- 4. Stuff your heart by putting small pieces in the hole and poking them in to fill the heart.
- 5. Stitch the hole shut and finish with three stitches on top of each other to secure the thread.
- 6. Hooray, you did it! Offer your heart to someone who needs a little love (and remember, it might be you).




- ~Please use 100% wool felt for an eco-friendly, durable little heart that is kind to people and our planet.
- ~ For stitching, I use two strands of 6-strand embroidery cotton; single strand perle thread is also good.
- ~Chenille needles work very well as they are sharp with a bigger eve. I use size 24.
- ~To stuff, pure wool or other eco-friendly stuffing is best. I stuff them to be quite firm as that makes a good tactile heart that will cope with lots of squeezing and pocket dwelling.
