Archaeologist's Follow Up Statement South Australia 17th October 2024



Four days on after the exciting discovery of the unusual egg at Woodend Primary, we have made several key findings. Bones were uncovered near the egg on Tuesday, and while they cannot belong to the creature inside, they may have been brought by its parents as food. This suggests a potentially complex and intriguing relationship between the creature and its environment. Additionally, a slime-like substance, possibly secreted by the egg, was found in the surrounding area on Wednesday.

Most remarkably, we have detected movement from within the egg, indicating that something is indeed alive inside. Today feathers were found nearby, which offer another clue possibly hinting at a bird-like species, though we are still far from confirming this.

Our team is working diligently to examine these new clues and gather more information.

We are carefully studying the bones, the residue, and the egg itself to gain a clearer picture of what might emerge.

The area remains secured, and we appreciate the community's ongoing interest and patience as we continue our investigation.
